Change of season provides perfect opportunity to start new routine

stored in plastic bags to prevent shriveling but The Elegant Farmer suggests you allow the apples to breathe.

If you're looking for those that keep best the following are listed in order of those with the longest to the shortest freshness: Golden Russet, Spartan, Empire, Golden and Red Delicious, Red Rome, Ida Red, Wisconsin Granny, Cortland, Jonathan, McCoun and McIntosh.
